# State Senator To File Religious Freedom Bill

State Sen. Scott Schneider, R-Indianapolis, plans to file a Religious Freedom Restoration Act during the upcoming legislative session.

While the details are still being worked out, the <u>Indy Star reports</u> the bill would allow small businesses to withhold services from same-sex customers.

The bill could have broad implications, according to Micah Clark, director of the American Family Association of Indiana, an organization lobbying for the measure.

It would allow small businesses — such as bakeries, caterers, florists, and wedding chapels — to refuse services to gay couples based on the owner's religious beliefs, he said. It would also allow adoption agencies to refuse to place children with same-sex couples, he said.

Religious rights advocates have hinted at supporting a measure like Schneider's <u>since same-sex marriage</u> <u>was legalized earlier this year.</u> Legal experts say, however, that, when it comes to the law, businesses can already refuse services to same-sex couples because there isn't a federal or state law prohibiting discrimination based on sexual orientation.

Schneider released a statement about the proposed legislation Monday:

Restoration Act that was passed unanimously by Congress and signed by President Bill Clinton in 1993. In reviewing that court ruling, it became clear that Indiana's laws were not reflective of federal law. This bill, which I plan to author this session, would match federal law in the state of Indiana. The language of the measure is still being finalized.

Schneider's press secretary says he plans to file the bill within the next week.
